**Kashelelia (Hello) from the warm sunny Island of Pohnpei!**

We pray that all is well with our supporting Churches and individuals.

We had a great visit with our son Aaron and were able to show him around the island. His trip was cut short due to physical needs that required him to get back to the States where he could get adequate treatment. He started getting a lot of boils, which are common here, but he was more prone to get them due to his immune system being down. He also had a couple of jaw teeth that broke in half and they were unable to be fixed here. Please continue to pray for Aaron, he has been in the hospital twice since getting back to the states due to his disease. At this point Patty or myself may have to come in to take Aaron to Pittsburgh for a re-evaluation to see what the future holds for him.

Patty, Andrew, Nathaniel and Cilla are all doing great. Please pray for the adoption process for Cilla which we have started this week. Pray that it will all go smoothly according to God's will. Andrew was "student of the month" at Calvary Christian Academy which made us proud parents to know that he was setting an example among the other students.

I had mentioned in my last prayer letter that they had found some WWII bombs here and I was hoping that they had found them all. Well, they found **MORE**, but I believe that this time they have found them all.

We are steadily learning the language, although it is a very difficult language to learn. Patty can actually sing songs in the Pohnpeian language, which is a real blessing. I usually catch her and Cilla singing together during the day. Patty and Cilla have so much in common, like singing and shopping. I'm just glad there's not a Wal-Mart here with those two together.

Since our last prayer letter we have seen three teenagers come to know Christ as their personal Saviour. Please pray for others that have raised their hands, but as of yet have not made a decision to accept Christ. There are also several villages that we have been scouting out for the potential of starting a Bible Study. We ask that you would pray about this along with us, that God would direct us to the right village.

We hope everyone had a wonderful Easter. Isn't it exciting to know that we serve a **RISEN** Saviour. Religions of today worship gods that are dead, but our Saviour is **ALIVE!** The blood stained cross is empty, the hollowed tomb echoes its emptiness, all pointing to the fact that He had power over death, hell and the grave. Almost 2,000 years later this is still the Power of the Gospel that we preach today. A life changing Gospel, one that is still good news to a far country.

Thank you so much for all your prayers that are so meaningful to us. The generosity of your financial giving enables us to labor for souls here 9,000 miles away in Micronesia.
