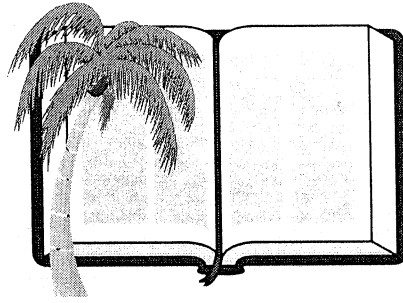

Dear Co-Laborers in Christ,

Greetings from the Island of Pohnpei!

Family:

We want to say thank you for being so diligent to pray for our family these last three months. My wife was able to return to Pohnpei in July after being in the states for almost three months to help with our oldest son Aaron's testing for his health problems and our youngest son Nathaniel's knee surgery and rehabilitation. Nathaniel has finished all his rehab on his knee and is doing much better. Aaron at this time is still undergoing evaluation and new testing. Upon my wife's arrival back on Pohnpei, we packed our bags and headed to Manila with our daughter Priscilla. After a number of tests, the doctors found that she had a problem known as "reflux," which was causing her to get repeated kidney infections. She underwent surgery and her kidneys are doing much better. During the testing, it was also discovered that Priscilla has rheumatic heart disease. We praise the Lord that this difficulty was identified in the early stages, and there is only minor damage to her heart. We will have to monitor Priscilla closely for fatigue, swelling of the joints and chest pain. She will also have to take a shot to prevent further damage every 21 days for the next 13 years. After three weeks in Manila, we were able to return to Pohnpei. We would ask that you continue to pray for Aaron, Nathaniel and Priscilla as they continue to recover.

Ministry:

God continues to bless the ministry here in a tremendous way. Since our last prayer letter, we have seen 10 people walk the aisle for salvation and many others have rededicated their lives to the Lord. We praise the Lord for how He has been moving in the lives of individuals here. Please continue to pray for the land in Tomworolong. The ministry continues to grow in that village and we are actively seeking God's will for the building of a church there.

Mission Highlight:

My wife learned a new meaning for disappointment. She found red bell peppers at the grocery store, an item which we rarely get on the island. She was excited and could almost taste the delicious flavor of the peppers. When she took them to the check-out counter and learned that they were priced at \$8.65 per pound, she gladly, (but with great disappointment) returned them to the display case!

Thank you so much for your continued prayer and sacrificial giving. May God continue to bless each of you as you serve Him.
