What a great year! The Lord met our needs, opened doors, and withstood our adversary! In this letter, I will share an update about our work for the Lord and two opportunities for the mission-hearted people in your church.

Two Opportunities

I am leading two missions trips to Boston and Scotland in 2021.

You may have noticed what it took some time for me to notice. There are scores of churches who would lead a missions trip, but they do not have enough people to organize a trip. The same churches may not know exactly how to lead a trip. These reasons led me to organize, as part of World Wide New Testament Baptist Missions, SeeTheHarvest.com.

I led the first See the Harvest trip to Utah in 2020. God blessed. He changed lives for eternity.

During this season of the pandemic, the Lord opened doors in Scotland. There is a section in southern Scotland with nine towns without a gospel witness. We are assembling a team to put literature at every door of the 25,000 homes reaching over 75,000 people.

I will also lead a team to Boston to help a church planter reach his community of 80,000 people. Boston has over a half million people who need to hear the gospel. We will have a tent set up in the town square, hold a youth rally, and evangelize with his church.
