Dear Praying Friend,

In my previous letter, I wrote about going to the Middle East in August. As it worked out in the timeline and providence of God, I met in May with over 30 pastors in the Middle East working with Edgar Feghaly. The Lord allowed me to meet with men who reminded me of the saints mentioned in Hebrews, "of whom the world was not worthy." I met with men who know about physical beatings for preaching the Gospel. I met with men and women who understand what it is to face persecution for their faith. These dear saints mentioned how they pray for me, the World Wide New Testament Baptist Missions staff, and the churches in America. They pled, "Remember us."



In June, I led a group to the greater Boston area on a See The Harvest trip. Eleven people came from the West and East. We helped church planter Nick Stelzig evangelize several neighborhoods with invitations to church. We placed Gospel tracts and invitations at the door of 2,500 homes in these neighborhoods. An area pastor told me we brought the Gospel to over 10,000 people who live in those homes.

We also went to two municipalities' fireworks events, where we shared Gospel tracts with well over 1,000 tracts and invitations to church. I was impressed with the respect received as we hand-delivered the Gospel to many who thanked us.


On the See The Harvest trip, we worked in an area that was 80% Hispanic. We had two Spanish-speaking preachers who preached in both languages as they translated for themselves. God spoke to the hearts of people.

I will leave on August 2, 2022, for Asia. COVID prevented many of the trips we ordinarily would have taken. World Wide has missionaries whose ministries I want to see. I want to encourage these missionaries in their labor and be a blessing to them and their family. I will be gone for three weeks. Please pray God will use me to encourage, evangelize, and strengthen God's people in Cambodia and Japan.

I will speak to the region's missionaries in Cambodia and visit with the Browns. Matthew Brown and his family served with World Wide New Testament Baptist Missions since 2011. I will also visit with the Riffels in Japan. Michael Riffel and his family served with World Wide New Testament Baptist Missions since 2007. In Japan, I will speak at the Riffel's church camp, coinciding when Japan celebrates the Festival of the Dead.

Please pray for these opportunities to serve the Lord and to strengthen the brethren.
