We are moving our stuff to Mexico the first of December. If we are not at 100% by that point, we will need to come back to finish deputation. However, we will be going either way, as we found lately that we can actually legalize our van. It will be the last chance to get this done since they will not legalize vehicles that are over ten years old – ours is a 2006. Pray that the cost of the process is not more than what the van would be worth.
