Our mission board had their annual Family Fellowship Week in the Shenandoah Valley in Virginia. The hosting church did a wonderful job. The food, fellowship with other missionaries, and the preaching were a great encouragement. I was able to meet with the missionary to Ghana that we will be helping next year. We are planning to leave with them when they return to the field. He has a container at his home church in Orangeburg, SC that we will be filling with things that will be needed there. We are excited that this is finally becoming a reality. Pray that God will provide what is needed there.
