Everyone here has been telling us how fortunate we were to find it, but we know that God gave it to us. Praise the Lord for answering the need.

We had a wonderful opportunity to be invited to a Nukuoran wedding here on Pohnpei. Jack was asked to speak and give some information about our plans once we reach Nukuoro. The Nukuoran Christians here on Pohnpei are very excited to finally have a missionary going to their little island. We have also been asked to help with a Bible study at the Nukuoran house here on Pohnpei, as well as doing the Wednesday night Bible study at the radio station. This is very exciting! God is opening many doors. A ship just left for Nukuoro in the last week, so it will be a while before another one goes down. Pray for God's timing in all this.
