We hit the ground running since we arrived for furlough on March 26th. So far we have been in 21 churches reporting on the work in Japan and have a full schedule until we go back on

July 9th. We will be traveling through 25 states altogether and speaking in 30 churches. *Please pray t*hat we will have safety traveling and be able to get refreshed spiritually, physically and emotionally as well.



We thank the Lord for all our supporting churches. They have been so welcoming and gracious to us and it has been wonderful to connect again with some folks we haven't seen in up to ten years. We are thankful for the opportunity to present our work in a few new churches as well. *Please pray that these would be able to take us on for support* (currently 90%). God has been blessing us with other needs being met. The widows jar ministry in Indiana helped provide many of Abigail's future textbooks as well as other supplies. Others have given us books for our church library for which we are so thankful. Another man provided us with a car for 3 weeks until we could fly to Missouri and pick up a van from BMTM (Baptist Missionary Transportation Ministry).

It has been wonderful to see the Lord use us in our furlough ministry. People have been making decisions and the other day we saw two young ladies receive the Lord in Junior Church. Praise God! Others are realizing more the need for the Gospel and missionaries in Japan. *Please pray the Lord would call more laborers to come to Japan*.

The Lord has also been working in our church in Japan. We are so thankful for all our members at Faith Baptist Church in Japan working so hard to continue the ministry there. Carolyn has been playing the piano and Mr. Kido preaching once a month and teaching the adult Sunday School as Clair teaches the children.
