With Rose Okada not knowing Japanese well or having a car, we have been helping as her four girls go to day care and her oldest, Samantha, attends sixth grade. In November, Samantha's class will go on their big 6th grade overnight field trip that the parents have been giving money toward since 1<sup>st</sup> grade. However, because the trip includes going to the Buddhist temple, Rose quickly decided that her daughter will not go. We are happy about her decision; however, this goes against the pressure from the culture here to do everything together and not stand out from the crowd. Samantha's teacher struggled with this and called April several times trying to convince us to change Rose's mind. He had never heard what Christians really believe but April was able to share the gospel with him. Sadly, he didn't understand, still wanted Samantha to go and said that he didn't want to tell the class that she was a Christian. Later, we found out that her school textbook even teaches negative things about Christianity. We can tell that Samantha is really struggling spiritually and wanting to fit in. She

has already faced times of bullying in her class for other reasons. Please pray for her under all this pressure and that she can have the courage to stand up and be a testimony for the Lord. These kinds of things burden our hearts more for the need for Christian education here. Please pray with us about this as well.
