### Greetings:

The Arteaga and Ramirez families would like to thank the following people and churches for the financial help of their boys, Raul and Josiel; Emmanuel Baptist Church of Swansboro, N.C.; Harvest Baptist Church of Murdock, FL.; Zion Baptist Church, of Lexington, KY.; and Joseph Marchese of Pt. Charlotte, FL. We pray that we have not omitted anyone and ask your forgiveness if some one's name or church has been omitted. They also want to thank everybody who sent get-well cards, prayers or notes of encouragement. The parents wanted to open the cards and letters, but Brother Jerry wouldn't allow it. He had the boys open them and the kids were delighted to get to do it!

It looks as if the boys have received enough money to pay for six months of therapy. That is, if they don't have any unseen medical expenses.

Report on their condition: Raul goes to a hospital 3 times per week and receives therapy on a variety of machines. He also receives therapy at home by a doctor three times per week and does light exercises and tries to keep his muscles toned. The doctors at first gave him no chance of ever walking again, but now say that he has shown improvement and give him a slight chance that he may walk.

Josiel was ordered to go to a different hospital for therapy three times a week, but they have no vehicle to get him there. The hospital sent an ambulance but it has not proven to be a good idea. Josiel was strapped down and mom and dad were allowed to accompany him, but the driver was so reckless and braked the ambulance so hard that the parents were thrown all over the back and Josiel was thrown hard against the straps and was so tense when he arrived that the therapist did not have good results. The parents begged the driver to slow down but he would not. They did this for three days and each day it was with a different driver, all with the same results. The parents decided to not take him to the hospital anymore until they get a vehicle. Like Raul, he receives three days of therapy (2 hours each day) in his home.

Note: A church has voted to give the family a small van equipped for invalids but there is a problem with the title and we cannot get it across the border without proper papers. Please be much in prayer for this vehicle.
