The last month has been very exciting. I received word this week that we have reached 26% of our needed support and are praying that we will surpass 30% by the end of this summer! This month for our Focus on the Field update, we will be featuring one of Boston's inner-city neighborhoods — Jamaica Plain. Jamaica Plain or JP was annexed into Boston in 1874. JP is known for its beautiful parks including: Jamaica Pond, the Arnold Arboretum, and portions of Franklin Park (Boston's largest park). There are 3.3 sq. mi. of housing space (excluding public property and parks) in Jamaica Plain and according to the 2010 U.S. Census there were 37,468 people living in JP.


Historically Jamaica Plain has been home to many immigrant workers who would work in the many factories and breweries in this neighborhood. Prior to the Prohibition, JP was home to over 25 breweries. The need of the gospel in this neighborhood has been very evident for a long time. Although many of these breweries didn't survive the Prohibition, the need for the gospel still remains.

JP is still home to many immigrants. In fact, due to the high percentage of Hispanic and Latino people in Jamaica Plain, portions of this neighborhood have become known as Jamaica Spain. Over 30% of the population of JP is Hispanic/Latino. Most of these people are from the Dominican Republic. 16.5% of the people of JP speak Spanish at home and 37.8% of those who speak Spanish are unable to speak English very well. The Lord has directed us to begin learning to speak Spanish as well as other languages so that these people can be reached with the Gospel in their own language.

Again, over time, with the lack of any like-minded, Bible preaching witness, the wickedness of JP has only gotten worse and worse. JP is considered to be the most lesbian friendly neighborhood in Boston, MA. In the first 90 days of 2016 over 225 violent crimes were reported in JP alone. In this year alone over 200 drug related crimes have been committed in Jamaica Plain. We believe that the more blatant sin is in a certain area, the more that area is in need of the Gospel but "how shall they hear without a preacher".
