God used your praying and giving to bless the inaugural service of "Iglesia Bíblica Bautista Esperanza" on Sunday November 6th. Weeks of preparation from many people went into the service; and the efforts were blessed. Visitors attended from Malacatepec and other nearby towns, and the most of all, the Word of God was preached.



Leading up to the service, several people commented that they wanted to get baptized once the church officially began. Praise to God, *"they that gladly received his word were baptized"* (Acts 2:41) on the first Sunday of the new church. The future vision for Hope House is to have a group home to house 80-100 men coming out of addiction. Thanks to the generosity of several churches, we have fenced the majority of the property, and are now digging to lay the foundation for the men's dorms.



Our current men are the workers (*on left*), and it's amazing to see them using their strength to serve God's purposes rather than throwing their lives away to sin and addiction.
