I don't think that we could have truly imagined what this first year would have been like, and I am certainly glad of that because God has stretched us well past our comfort zones as He patiently works us as the potter works clay.

My father-in-law and I were able to work on some projects around the house that I have been needing to get done but required a couple of more hands than I have and a little more expertise to get them done right. As we look to beginning a new year of ministry, Sarah and I were discussing where we think that the Lord may be leading us at this time. surface level. What can man *really* do to us? Can man separate us from the love of God? Not according to Romans 8. Can man take away our salvation? Not according to I John 5. Can man take away our joy and happiness? Not if we have our eyes forcused on God like Philippians 4:4 says. While man can do many physical things, it is only by the permission of God. And if it has God's permission behind it, then we know that it can and will work for His glory and our best. As we (you and us) begin this new year, let us be more aware of what God can do *through* us than what man can try to do *to* us. The battle is very evident here in Chuuk between Light and Dark. As we face situations that have arisen or that will arise, as I am sure they will, please be praying that God's hand would be mighty and that He would get the glory when everything else seems impossible.

We are grateful for each of you. May your new year be more than happy; may it be filled with the presence and joy of God!
