Darleen and I left Kings Mountain on the eleventh of July. We are spending almost a month in Montana and Colorado. I am preaching in a few churches, and we are visiting others to give the pastor some information on

World Wide New Testament Baptist Mission. Hopefully when our missionaries call the pastor he will have a point of reference.



There are some great needs across Montana, but I have been blessed to see the good works that our Lord has established through faithful men. Some of these works have been laboring for many years, but many are in the early stages of development. You would think that with all of the open land purchasing property would be rather inexpensive. However, that is not the case at all. It makes it very difficult for these small groups to buy enough land to build a church.

I have met other men that are on deputation to come to the West in church planting ministries, but many more are needed. Let's pray that the Lord of the harvest will call others for this very important task. In some areas men will have to start several small works because the people are so scattered.

I just received some information from Missionary Edgar Feghaly concerning a conference in the Middle East next May. I want to share this information with you now with the hope that many will make plans to visit this very important part of the world.



The conference will be in Lebanon, and then travel on to Syria and Jordan to visit churches and historical sites. The trip will include the ancient city of Tyre and

Biblos, as well as Petra, Mount Nebo and the Dead Sea. More importantly you will meet many wonderful believers that are serving Christ in this very difficult region of the world. The trip will take place on May 16-28, 2009. The cost will be around \$3400, and will include airfare, ground transportation, three meals a day and sightseeing. Please make this a matter of prayer. It is especially important that pastors from the States should meet the men serving Christ in these countries.
