has given us a greater opportunity than in the past to show her the love of God. We have given her Gospel tracts, as have others, but she still

holds to her Jehovah Witness religion. She allows us to pray with her before we leave each day and she reads the Bible lessons we give her. Please pray with us for her spiritual need that she will realize that Jesus Christ is the answer.



We thank the Lord for each of you that so faithfully pray for us and support us financially. Please keep these two ladies in your prayers. Also pray for the monthly men's meetings, for lives to be touched and God to be glorified in us as we seek to reach others in Delta that are lost without the Lord.
