
A few weeks ago Nancy and I were just about ready to call it a night. It was 10:30 p.m. when my cell phone rang. I recognized the phone number of a lady that we have had contact with off and on for a while. We had told her that if she needed us, to call any time. There is a real spiritual need in her home as well as physicals needs. A lot is going on and she is really struggling as she faces one battle after another. She asked if we could come visit her right then. Nancy and I went and spent the next hour and 45 minutes listening and talking and praying with her. Please keep this lady and her family in prayer.

There is a man that God keeps bring into our lives. He lives off the grid with no power, no running water and no drivable road to his cabin. By Delta standards, it is not that uncommon. We first met him sometime back as he was standing on the road hitchhiking into Delta. We had been down the Alaska Highway visiting and were headed back home when we saw him and stopped to give him a ride. We handed him a tract when we dropped him off in town. Since that time, I have had more contact with him. I have had several opportunities to witness to him and he accepted a New Testament and a tract from me. Just this last week, I was able to witness to him one more time. This time he began to talk more and had a lot of questions. Before he would avoid answering or just ignore me altogether. As I dropped him off at the trail to his cabin, I asked him again if he had thought about where he was going to spend eternity. He did not answer. I told him again about God's love for him. As I was about to give him another tract, he remarked that he has three of those tracts at home now. I asked him to please read them and do what they say. I hope to take a trip out to his cabin to visit him soon. When I asked if I could, he was open to me coming. Please pray that God will touch his heart and that he will come to know the Lord.

Please pray for us that we will always follow the leading of the Holy Spirit when God brings someone our way, that we will be a witness, no matter what the circumstances might be or the hour of the day. Also continue to keep Nancy in your prayers. Her leukemia levels vary a little with each blood test, which is normal. In December the levels were undetectable for the first time since she began treatment in October 2013. In March they were just slightly detectable. She had her latest 3-month blood test last week and we will get the results at her next appointment on the 15th. Pray with us that, if it is God's will, the leukemia will be undetectable again. Either way, up or down, we know God is in control of it all and we will praise Him, no matter the results.
