What a summer and fall this has been. But through it all God has been so good. He is good all the time. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me" 2 Corinthians 12:9. God's grace is so wonderful. His marvelous saving grace, His loving, gracious, daily grace is there when things seem to be going in the wrong direction, from our perspective, and we want it all to be better.
