We pray for more opportunities to witness to him and that God will open his heart to the gospel. I continue to have weekly Bible studies with Jonathan and see Michael as well. A couple of times a week we continue to visit those who cannot get out and come to church. We also take them groceries or other items they may need. There is one that we shuttle back and forth to Fairbanks for medical appointments. We are thankful for all the opportunities God gives us to share the gospel - through the church, helps ministry, as well as the fire chaplain ministry which has opened doors to Russians and Ukrainians also.

In March of 2014, I was asked to become the Chaplain of the Interior Alaska Medical Clinic.
