Greetings from Delta Junction, Alaska,

What a time this is! None of us could have ever imagined what has taken place in the past several months. But isn't it wonderful to know that the God we serve, not only knows about it, but also knew about it before the foundation of the world? What a wonderful God we serve. "O give thanks unto the Lord, for he is good: for his mercy endureth for ever." Psalm 107:1, "Great is our Lord, and of great power: his understanding is infinite." Psalm 147:5. We can rest in the loving arms of our Heavenly Father. He is in control of it all.

Just like most of you, we have had to change the way we do ministry. Services have been interrupted and home visits are limited as well. But God has opened other ways to minister to the people here in Delta Junction. We have learned to be more flexible and to be open to other methods of ministry that in the past we knew were available but were not being utilized. But if we will let God do the leading, we will be amazed at what He will and can do when we will stop limiting Him by our lack of faith.

Nancy has been in contact with her and we are planning to work with her more when Nancy returns from visiting her parents in North Carolina.
