Greetings from Burlington, North Carolina. Nancy and I were to fly back to Alaska on January 31st for three weeks to take care of some things, both ministry and personal. But God had another plan. Please keep him in prayer as he is in a skilled nursing facility for rehab to help him regain strength and mobility. Because of their gift as well as gifts from many more churches and individuals, we were able to put a large down payment on a 2010 4x4 Yukon XL. It is 12 years newer than what we have now and definitely in much better shape. We still owe more on it and must spend a little more to outfit it and get it winterized for Alaska winters before we head back home. We praise the Lord for all of you that have given for the purchase of the vehicle. Please continue to pray that the rest of the funds will come in so that it will be paid for before we leave for Alaska. We serve a gracious and merciful God. He is good all the time. We continue to trust Him and pray that His will be done in our lives, no matter where we may be serving Him.

Please keep those in Alaska in your prayers. The spiritual need is great. Pray also for the physical needs due to food supply shortages, sickness and difficulties caused by the severe weather. Flooding is always a concern when the spring thaw arrives, but with the larger than normal snowfall, flooding will be a great threat. Please continue to keep Nancy and her parents in prayer and pray that we will stay focused on our Savior and trust Him with unwavering faith.
