The last week of October we enjoyed the Caribbean Baptist FBF meetings and renewed fellowship with many former students that are now pastoring in many islands here. The meetings were challenging and uplifting.

After Thanksgiving, our son Paul, Sherry, and Clara came for the weekend to report to Calvary Baptist Tabernacle and to share the burden of starting a Christian Day School in Yap. As a result a young couple is praying about going to Yap to teach. The wife will be graduating this May and she has sign language experience which will be needed in Yap, as there is no one there who can sign. Then during Christmas vacation we were able to spend some time in Michigan with 4 of our children and families.

Last semester Opal helped in the library and taught 2 high school art classes and assisted Mrs. Sherlie with several other lower grade classes. This semester Opal will again be helping in the library, teaching art, and entering student reports for Miss Dubber, school principal. I taught Hebrew 101, Bible Doctrines I, and Baptist Polity besides substituting for Pastor White's Adult Sunday School Class once per month when he has National Guard as a Chaplain. This semester I will be teaching Hebrew 102, General Epistles, Bible Doctrines II, Baptist History, and ESL for 3hrs a day.

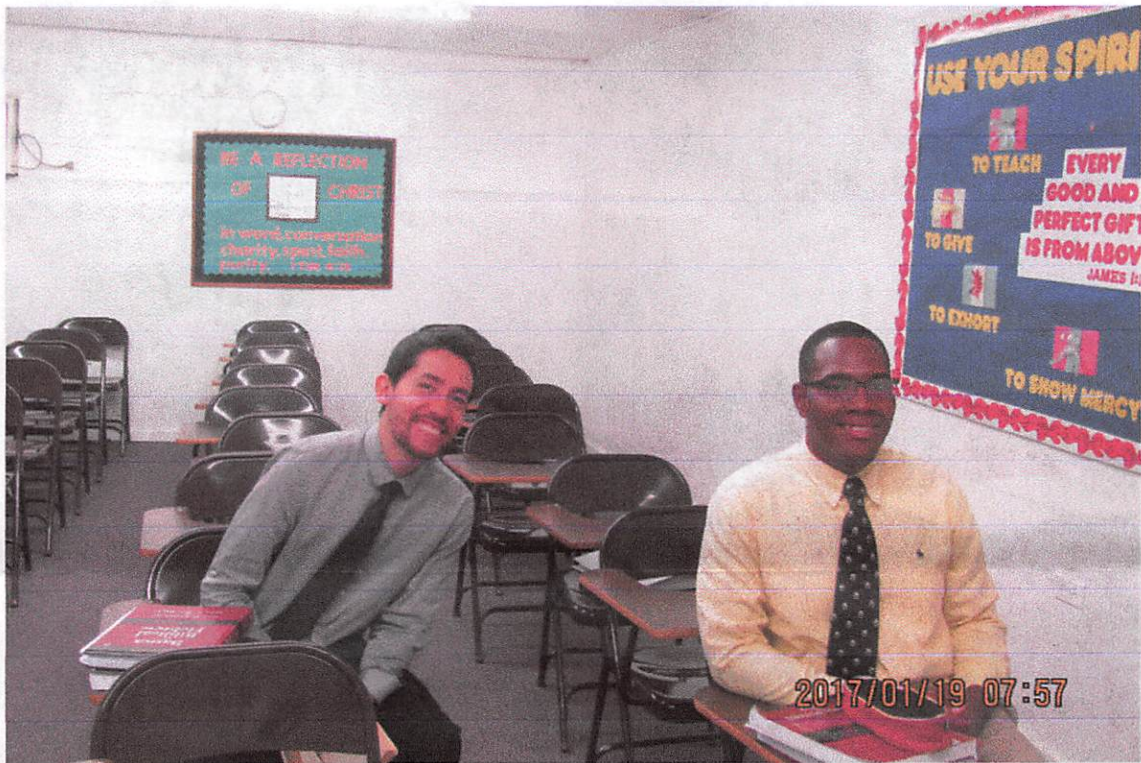

The next week some men in the Rock of Ages Prison ministry set up chapters in several cities here on the Island.

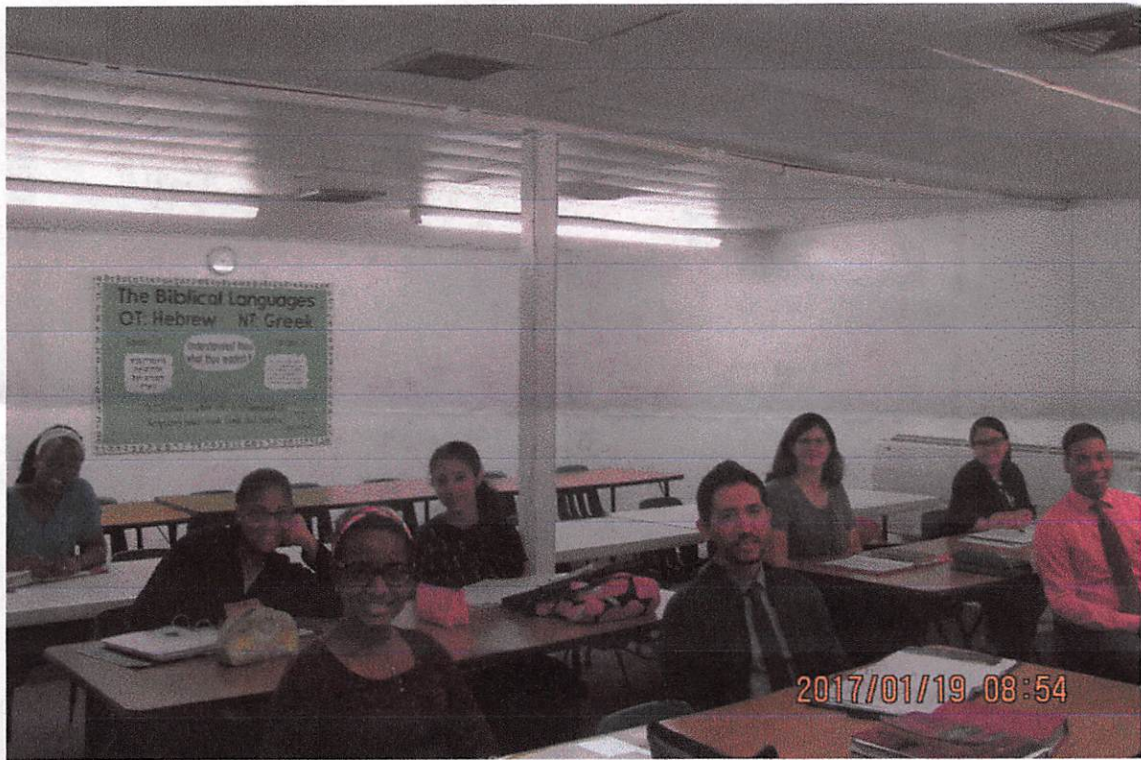

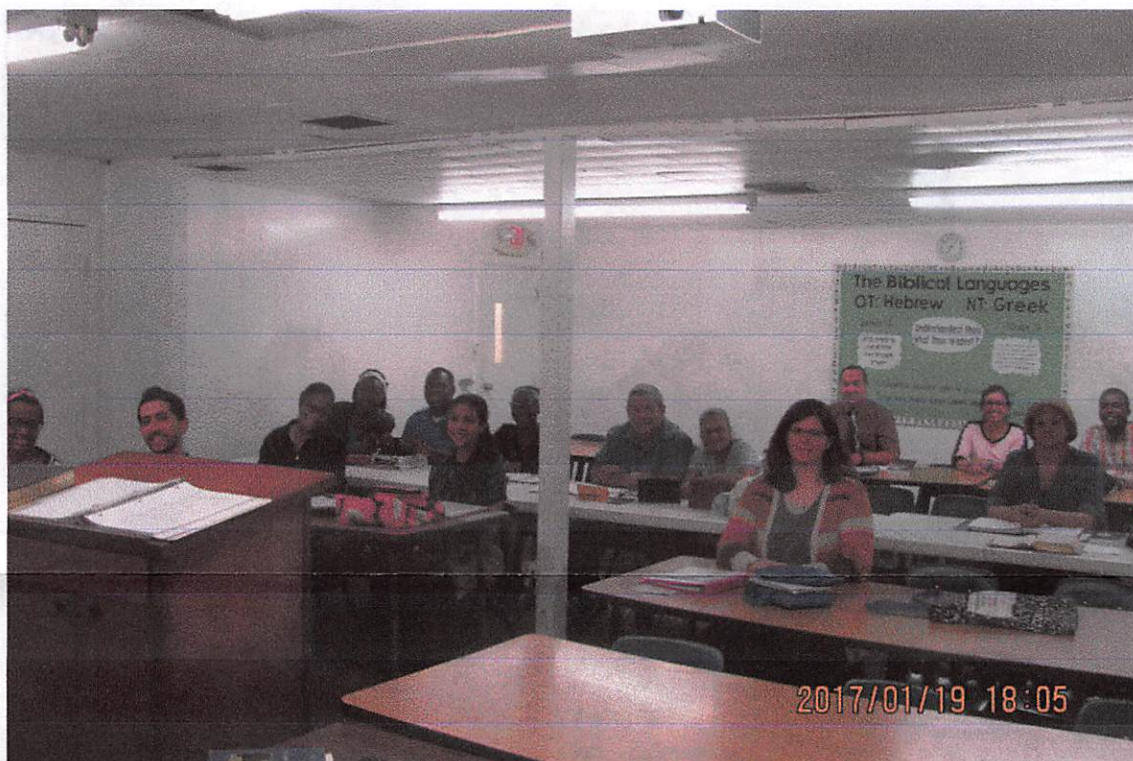

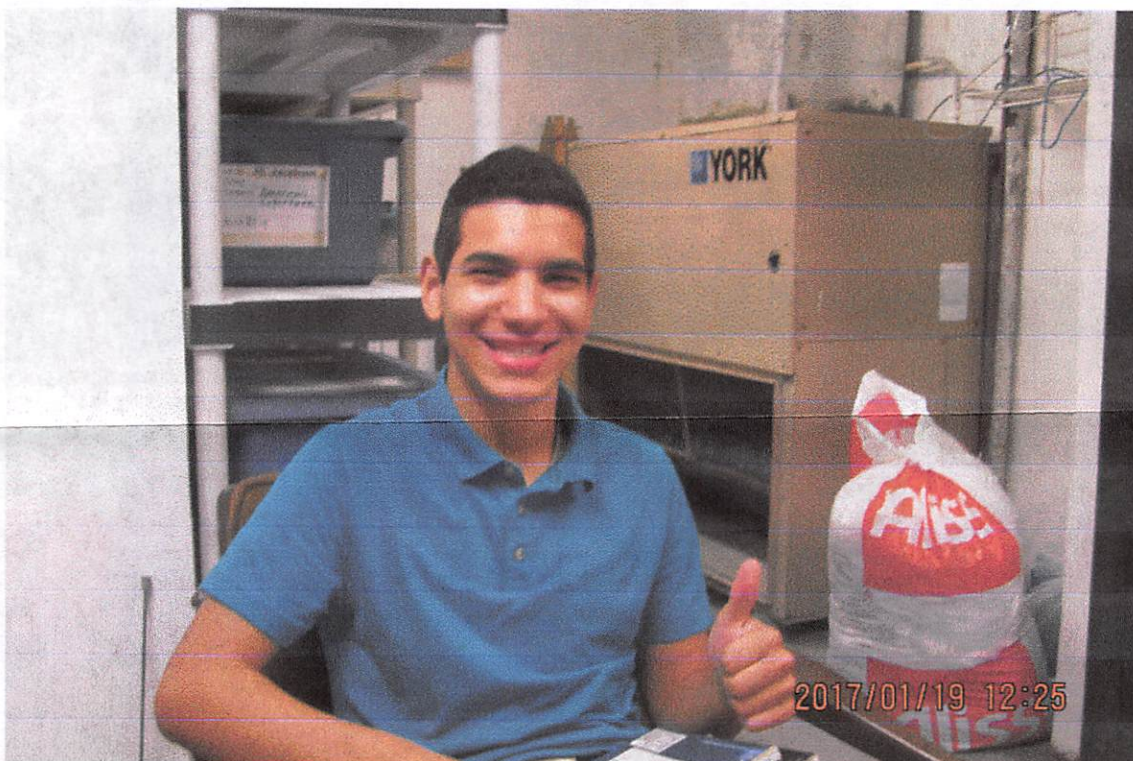
