God allowed them to stay with John and Jamie in Palau as well, so they saw all three Zimmer families out here in Micronesia.

Roland came up with "God is So Good" in 8 languages, all represented by church people. We sang it in all those languages and each group cheered us on.

Visiting short-term missionaries, Pastor Jerry and Dawn Walker, are staying out at the Whitmores while Bob and Polly are in the States. We were blessed to have them come and minister to our church on a Sunday morning.

We have been working on cutting some trees for our village chief, as well as helping Paul put up the 100 foot radio tower we took down about a year ago. All those years of roofing came in handy with the extreme heights involved! Paul plans to put up another 100 feet of tower making this one 200 feet tall. Please pray that God would give us wisdom and safety as we work.

We had a baptismal service in the church last Sunday. One of our church members said he knew how to fix our leaky baptismal, so he worked on it for a week or so. 5 recently saved Christians followed the Lord in believer's baptism. Pictured above is Roland's brother, Patwin (left), and Romeo's mom, Theresa (right). 3 teenage girls who recently accepted the Lord were baptized also. The tank still leaked a little, but I just told the people that the tide was rising so they might want to take their shoes off!! We were able to finish and empty the tank before it got out of hand!

We have a goal of inviting each family in our church over to our home in order to get to know each of them more personally. Diane has been wanting to know how to make some of the delicious Filipino food that several ladies bring to our church feasts. Elna and Miricci came over one Saturday afternoon and cooked for 5 hours. All of our families enjoyed Pancit, Lumpia, Buko-Pandan Salad and LeChe Flan.
