Dear Friends,

Yap Baptist's first service of the New Year involved voting on having Roland replace me as the pastor of the church while we are on a one-year furlough, beginning the end of May. The long-term plan is for Roland to serve in the church for the one year, and upon our return, we hope to assist and provide support for Roland and his brother James to start a new work on their home island, Fais, an outer island of Yap. The vote was a unanimous agreement to accept him and his family to minister as pastor. We are thankful for his testimony and faithful service to the Lord. Some 5 years ago, Pastor Joe Cannon had Roland live here in this house during his absence, and now we have decided to allow Roland and his growing family to stay in the house while we are gone. His brother James, who will graduate from HBBI and marry in May, has expressed his desire to serve here as youth pastor and will stay in Roland's current home. Another graduating HBBI student, Lucy, will be staying in the guest room and helping in the children's ministries. If God lays it on your heart to help these islanders financially while they serve in the church, you may contact us and we will let you know how to make it possible.

The end of January, Roland organized a joint teen meeting with Faith Baptist which included a competitive basketball tournament! The teens seemed to have a great time, even though our team was crushed by the giants on their team! We appropriately watched the movie "Facing the Giants," after we had some good food provided by the ministry wives. After the movie, I gave a short challenge about facing the giants that they have in their lives. Many of the teens responded to their desire to stand for God even when the temptations are strong. Please pray for these young people that they will make right choices to follow the Lord with their lives although their culture tries to pull them away.

In February, we started a few milling projects and spent several weeks working on making lumber for a few of our friends and neighbors. The Lord provided some nice trees that were owned by our village chief. He was in need of some boards for his house and gave us 50% of the wood. The other 2 projects were for George, a member of our church, and Tony, a man we have been witnessing to for several years. Roland and I want to put hardwood flooring on the church platform, and the Lord provided the material and much more. This was a great opportunity to share the gospel and also meet some new people.

My son, John Mark, had to write a poem for his English class, and he chose to write on milling in the jungle. We all kind of pitched in our ideas and I thought he summed up milling pretty well!

"Milling with my Dad" Would you like to go milling, With the chirping birds singing And the poison tree stinging? Chainsaws blaring, "Vrrrroooom!" Tall, towering, trees Crashing with a boom! Sweaty men are grunting. Monster logs are rolling. Milling blades are whirling. Mahogany boards, strong and straight, Milling with my dad is great!
