PLANS TO RETURN TO YAP

God answers prayer! We are thankful that the Lord allowed Diane's surgery to be successful and brought her back to full health making it possible for us to return to Yap. It has been two years since we left our island home, and although there have been paths we wouldn't have chosen, God has shown Himself faithful, sufficient, and sovereign as He has walked along beside us.

We are scheduled to leave Greenville on September 20, passing through Guam for a few days to visit our students and friends at Harvest Baptist Bible College, and then arriving in Yap on September 28. The borders have opened to Yap now, and hopefully there will only be a home quarantine required at that time.
