Each time we begin planning to return for a furlough, we pray for the Lord to prepare the right ones to lead the ministry while we are away. Throughout the last 20 years, God has raised up several young men who have been discipled and trained and then encouraged to pastor Yap Baptist Church on their own. Rollence Lug and James Layomai stepped into that position during our previous furloughs and then went on to plant their own churches on neighboring islands. Others included Patwin Hafeleichog, who now serves as pastor of Fais Baptist Church, and Klinton Euthemar and Truly Erra who both serve on Guam.

We have specifically prayed that Yap Baptist Church could be pastored by a mainland Yapese pastor, and during the past couple of years, God has seen fit to answer this prayer. When we left for furlough in October, two Yapese men, Francis Bechey and Steven Limarag, stepped in to lead Yap Baptist Church. Francis began attending our church when he was in 3rd grade and through the years has shown a heart that desires to follow and serve the Lord. He was a soul winner while in high school, always bringing new friends to hear the gospel. Steven Limarag and Adam Yowanug were two of those friends who accepted Christ and went on to train at Harvest in Guam. Now these guys are back, serving together at YBC! This is definitely the Lord's doing and is truly marvelous!


